Humanitarian Division

<u>-Children's House</u>: Child-friendly, multidisciplinary and interagency model for Sexually Abused Children. The services provided are: Social Support & Rehabilitation, Forensic Interview, Multidisciplinary / Multi thematic cooperation, Medical Examinations, Family Therapy, Psychological Evaluation, Psychological Support & Therapy.;

<u>-Children's Shelter</u>: holistic support to Unaccompanied Children -Accommodation, Rehabilitation & Integration services. It operates in collaboration with Social Welfare Services;

<u>- Social Work Department:</u> It records the social history of the minors and follows up their care plan (socio-economic aspect);

<u>- Child Protection Department:</u> It offers information to the minors about the steps of their international protection application, their rights and obligations;

- Education & Awareness Department: it addresses the basic needs of child development and provides extracurricular activities;

<u>- Psychology Department</u>: it manages psychological support, holistic care and crisis intervention;

<u>- Foster Care Department</u>: it identifies and assesses potential foster parents to undertake the care of children who are under the legal guardianship of the State; provides 24/7 support to foster parents.

Research & development division

Its primary mandate is to: • Undertake and coordinate **EU projects** and research initiatives, also in cooperation with external partners. • Contribute to research initiatives of partners and other stakeholders on **child rights issues**. •Analyse laws and policies



BIG TIME TAKEOVER

It is a European Project that aims at empowering young people to use their creativity and the technology in positive ways and making positive change in youth's local environment.

June 2021: start of the project with partners from 5 countries: Italy, Cyprus, UK, North Macedonia and Poland

July 2021 – **December 2021:** Preparation & finalization of a toolkit designed together with Youth Art Educators.

MEDIS

Mediterranean Inclusive School

It has been a programme consisting of different phases carrying out to strengthen and consolidate social cohesion, intercultural education and local language in a multilingual framework of newly arrived migrants at primary and secondary schools through the Mediterranean Inclusive Schools Programme. March 2021: First and second round of the piloting activities.

In total MEDIS partnership has reached 90 schools, 167 trainers and 1488 students.

06 July 2021: Final conference

Partners of 6 European countries had presented policy recommendations, outcomes of the project and good practices implemented.

YCREATE

It is a project that aims to equip young people to counteract hate speech and violent behavior, disinformation and misinformation (offline and online) targeted at minorities and vulnerable communities. Through creative, art-based, participatory, and digital activities YCREATE wants to promote the civic and social participation of young people and strengthen their support to the local community.

August 2021: Start to develop YCreate curriculum programme.

21-22 October 2021: First partnership meeting that took place in Rome, Italy. Partners had the opportunity to get to know each other and discuss the continuation of the project.

TRANSNATIONAL YOUTH FORUM 2022

Climate Change, Global Concerns and impact on the Rights of the Future Generations

It is a project funded by Erasmus+ Programme which aims to encourage mutual dialogue on Climate Change and its inextricable link with the violation of the Rights of Future Generations.

16 March 2021: 40 students from Cyprus, Portugal, Italy and UK had participated in a workshop presenting the Final Report "Climate Change, Global Concerns and the Rights of future generations", preparing policy-recommendations and advocacy actions.

17 March 2021 - Final Conference:

The participants discussed the project's outcomes with local environmental, youth NGO's experts and decision-makers.

FA.B!

Family Based care for Children in Migration

It is a transnational project with partners from Italy, Cyprus, Malta, Spain and Greece aimed at supporting the improvement and expansion of quality alternative familybased care system for unaccompanied migrant children.

24-25 June 2021: 2nd Field Experience event in Malta that aim to support the improvement and expansion of the alternative family-based care system for unaccompanied migrant children.

29-30 July 2021: 3rd Sharing Experience Event in Nicosia, Cyprus hosted by HFC aiming to present the opportunities & challenges of the local family-based care system for Unaccompanied Migrant Children. 16-17 September 2021: 4th Sharing
Experience Event in Athens, Greece. The participants had the opportunity to hear about how the Greek system works regarding unaccompanied Minors and what steps are taken towards the implementation of family-based care.
14-15 October 2021: Final event of the Sharing experience that took place in

Madrid, Spain. Partners heard about how the system works for Unaccompanied Minors (UMs).

14-15/12/2021: Training course for professionals about family-based care & unaccompanied minors.

RISIV

Regenerate, Innovate: Social Impact Volunteering for Youth

It is a project that aims at providing an innovative model of social inclusion through youth participation in community service. By designing and validating new support material for youth workers, RISIV provides a better preparation for young people involved in volunteering or internships experiences.

23-24 November 2021 - First Transnational Partnership Meeting:

Two representatives of Hope for Children traveled to France to discuss with the partners further steps towards the implementation of the project.

November 2021 - Developed the RISIV Pedagogy Roadmap:

The roadmap has combined the theory behind the RISIV pedagogy and the practical elements that require the expertise of professionals in the field. This enabled the project partners to individuate a precise set of skills for youth workers and young volunteers working on SIPs (Social Impact projects) that can help professionals to rely on this material when developing a social impact project in their local communities.

Every partner has conducted a variety of interviews and focus group in their countries with their corresponding target groups. 22 young people and 24 professionals have contributed to determine which competences and skills they wanted to develop.

CARE Leaving with care – Living with care

It aims at investigating what is the trauma that children may experience during the process of investigation, removal and outof-home placement. By improving skills of first responders (such as social workers, police officers and helpline operators) CARE works towards to reduce the trauma that children may encounter during these processes.

02 February 2021 - 2nd transnational meeting

The project partners made an overview of all their actions and discussed the training needs of the professionals of the "front line" bodies for developing a range of trauma-centered approaches at EU level.

BASE

Migrant and refugee child-friendly support services in cases of sexual and gender-based violence It addresses the need to counteract GBV against refugee/migrant girls through the development and sustainability of strategies to nurture inclusive communication and a culture of trust between support service professionals, victims, families and communities, thus preventing victim re-traumatization and encouraging reporting of GBV.

12 February 2021 - "Migrant Women Empowerment in Cyprus society" online event:

HFC had presented BASE project and the role of Cultural Advisors in the Cypriot context. The European NGO, "Project Phenix" attended the event, contributing to strengthening the efforts of the programme.

22 March 2021 - Transnational conference:

Human Rights Advocates, Support Service Professionals, Survivors of GBV, Representatives of Civil Society Organizations and Migrant Community from all the countries had participated to the meeting in order discuss the role that Cultural Advisors and Community Advocates can have in raising awareness on Gender Based Violence and how to support professionals handling cases of sexual abuse.

INCLUDE

It is a project aimed to enhance the wellbeing of children at all stages of an international child abduction by providing guidelines and good practices to legal and other professionals.

In **2021** the INCLUDE project partners:

- Created the Guide to Good Practice, a good practice guide based on youngsters' views to professionals involved in international child abduction cases;
- Organized the final conference for legals and other professionals.

5 SHADES OF BLUE

It is a one year European project providing a training course on project management focused on migration that brings together representatives of Organisations from Mediterranean countries

21-29 July 2021 - Training course in Rome on project management with a focus on Migration:

The course brought together representatives from Italy, Spain, Cyprus, Slovenia, Bulgaria, France and Croatia in order to improve the participants' skills on the design & overall coordination of nonformal education projects based on the inclusion of migrants, asylum seekers and refugees.

In **2021** the 5 Shades of Blue project partners:

Realized an **handbook** for sharing ideas, methods, inputs and suggestions for improving the skills in the design, coordination and evaluation of non-formal education projects focused on the social inclusion of migrants, asylum seekers and refugees.

The **Handbook** is a source of inspiration and reflection based on the comments shared by the participants and trainers who attended the training course in Rome.

KEEP ME SAFE

Supporting youth peer development tacking sexual abuse

It is a transnational project bringing together experts from organizations across 6 EU countries to counteract sexual violence by: Fostering youth agency; Promoting youth worker's capacity to identify risks & counteract them through youth work; Producing a Competence Framework for European youth workers in the field of prevention and awareness raising of sexual abuse.

02 September 2021 - Final Conference:

Representatives from partner organizations enabled transnational debate between

decision-makers, practitioners and representatives involved in child protection and youth peer strategies.

EUROPEAN SOLIDARITY CORPS





Child Abduction Alert:

HFC in cooperation with SPAVO operates the child alert mechanism in Cyprus.

A) enables all relevant stakeholders to cooperate and work under a unified system to enhance the efforts of the police to trace missing children and combat this phenomenon.

B) mandate from Cyprus Police to operate the child alert system in Cyprus.

National Helpline for Children and Families - 1466

Provides psychological, social and legal support, counselling and guidance for matters related to child protection. Operates 24-hours a day, 365 days a year, free of charge

116000 – European Hotline for Missing Children: A tool for:
